Things to keep in mind.

Choosing your research topic

Make sure it is narrow enough to do in 2-3 pages of written explication.

Good search terms make your research much easier. Think of those things that relate to your topic and search those terms for information related to your subject to support your thesis statement or question you are trying to answer. Make sure you can find enough information to answer your question.

Remember when taking notes make sure you put quotations around information that you copy directly from a source.

Otherwise make sure you summarize and paraphrase the information you are gathering.

Don't forget to keep track of where you got your research on a notecard

APA Citation Creators

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Make sure that you reformat them with hanging indent and double space and put them in alphabetical order for your reference page.
